No, He was thinking about His own wedding day. "But Jesus doesn't get married!" Yes, He does! Jesus and His friends were once picked on for having too much fun, and not mournfully fasting and praying. Jesus answered, "how can the wedding guests fast when the Bridegroom is still with them?" (Mt 9:15)
